### Gift Statement

This scholarship was created to honor the life of Michael Johnson, alumnus and faculty member of Park University.

### Donor Information

Michael Johnson was known as an individual who gave of himself to his family, friends and students. Devoted to his country, he proudly served in the military and believed in the value of patriotism and service.

### Scholarship Agreement

THE MICHAEL JOHNSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP is intended to be a "pass through" scholarship, where gifts given in his memory each year are used to award scholarships to students who meet the qualifications. The donors reserve the right to decide to create an endowment to fund this scholarship for future generations.

THE UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE will review the qualifications of all applicants and award the scholarship annually. Use of the funds must be in accordance with established financial policies at Park University and with accrediting association standards.

RECIPIENT QUALIFICATIONS: The recipient shall be a full-time student (enrolled in 12-credit hours or more each semester) and who has:

- Served in any branch of the United States military (Marine Corps, Army, Navy, Air Force or Coast Guard)
- Left the service by being honorably discharged
- Is pursuing a degree in history or education
- Attends any Park University campus center or Online program
- Writes an essay about how they will use their education to further their career or community service goals

The scholarship award will be awarded to one student each academic year; the amount of the award will vary from year to year depending upon the gifts received, and the amount determined in consultation with Mrs. Julie Johnson. The student who is selected to receive the award may apply for the scholarship again. If no student qualifies for the scholarship in a given year, the gifts shall be retained in a restricted fund for use in subsequent years. Each recipient of a scholarship awarded from the fund shall be designated a MICHAEL JOHNSON SCHOLAR.
