

Adventures in Television Camp

In this hands-on workshop, students will learn the basics of TV production, include writing, shooting, editing, and announcing. Students will write, shoot, and edit their own television stories, which they will then put together into a professional newscast that will be posted on the web and burned to DVD. No experience or equipment is needed, only a willingness to work hard and have fun!
