

## How to Cite Electronic Sources (MLA 6<sup>th</sup> Edition)

Generally, this is the information you must cite, the order in the citation, and punctuation:

Last name, First name of author. "Title of Web Page." Date of posting or last update.

Name of organization, company, school or group which posted the info. Date retrieved. <Full website address>.

Example of typical reference:

Luddy, John. "Congress Should Hold Hearings Before Allowing Woman in Combat."

27 July 1994. Heritage Foundation Backgrounder. 19 Apr. 2000.
